Hospitals and Supplies

1. Approves the use of stashed supplies;
2. Draws the attention to the fact that supplies can be destroyed or damaged by various situations on the way to hospitals;
3. Calls upon funding to hire more medical healthcare professionals;
4. Supports the building of medical schools;
5. Calls upon the lack of treatment facilities;

6. Invites the normalization of mask wearing;
7. Calls for more access to hospitals during pandemics;

Technology, Regulations and Resources

8. Endorses putting more money into cleaner living conditions;
9. Recommends strengthening global health and early warning systems;
10. Calls for easier to understand healthcare guidelines;
11. Requires the use of more efficient response systems;
12. Encourages more advanced technology for future pandemics;
13. Draws the attention for investing in higher tech hospitals;
14. Encourages strengthening international health regulations;

Facilities and Doctors

15. Calls for better and cleaner sanitation facilities;
16. Considers increasing emergency response and capacity building;
17. Endorses hiring more scientists and doctors to prevent the spread of disease;
18. Draws the attention to putting more money towards research centers;

Vaccines and Medicine

19. Endorses vaccination at a young age;
20. Urges countries to spend more money on vaccinations;
21. Supports countries to invest in scientists for the research of vaccination and development;
22. Requests more vaccinations for women and children;
23. Encourages inexpensive vaccines in hospitals;
24. Further invites more policies about pandemics.
