#### Topic: Relationship between Disarmament and Sustainable Development

Alarmed by the lack of transparency in balancing disarmament and sustainable development,

Noting with deep concern that most human rights are not respected when a state goes to war,

Alarmed by the poor management of public arms use,

Deeply concerned about the prioritization of military instead of the Sustainable Development Goals,

Recognizing the need to invest more in the Sustainable Development Goals,

Deeply disturbed by the amount of governments that prioritize military resources over sustainable development,

### The Transparency of Military Expenditure

- 1. Suggests an international congress of the relationship between disarmament and sustainable development;
- 2. Encourages schools to warn the youth about military expenditure;
- 3. Further requests that existing UN initiatives are improved;
- 4. Calls upon governments to limit the deployment of soldiers who are drafted;

#### Governmental Influence

- 5. Endorses the promotion of UN peace initiatives;
- 6. Requires the establishment of more treaties for disarmament;
- 7. Calls for the monitoring of illegal arms manufacturing;
- 8. Encourages balanced decisions for money distribution from nations;
- 9. Urges governments to allocate weapons only if needed;

### SDG's

- 10. Encourages the promotion towards programs, rallies and events that support SDG's;
- 11. Also urges a major dedication towards education of SDG'S;
- 12. Calls upon governments to invest more in economic practises and education;

# **Developmental needs**

- 13. Further invites the redirection of the funds invested in the military to sustainable development;
- 14. Supports the reduction of unnecessary military bases and weapons;
- 15. Implores governments to double down on global charities;
