Topic: Engaging boys and young men in gender equality

Considering the importance of gender equality on an international scale,

Noting with deep concern the lack of gender equality programs in society,

Educational Programs for Gender Equality

1. Welcome both male and female models to help teach gender equality in our society;
2. Encouraging communities to engage in educational programs on social media platforms;
3. Supporting organizations and men engaging campaigns dedicated to gender equality;
4. Calls for funding sexual assault awareness programs;
5. Encouraging kids to engage in educational activities that promote gender equality;

Raising Awareness Globally

6. Further invites international organizations to collaborate in raising awareness using local and nationwide events, and social media platforms for a gender equal world;
7. Urges men to raise awareness and engage in gender equality worldwide;
8. Providing equal opportunities, rights, and treatment between men and women;

Eliminating Violence and Stereotypes

9. Strongly encourages eliminating deeply-inked gender based stereotypes by using media to promote characters that challenge gender roles;
10. Calls upon governmental institutions to recognize the importance of gender equality whilst working on laws and policies that minimize the issue;
11. Recommends parents to educate both themselves and their children on gender based violence using educational programs about toxic masculinity and its consequences;
12. Instructs schools to prevent gender violence at all costs;
13. Emphasizes the promotion of gender equality programs in publicity;

Funding for All Gender Equality Campaigns

14. Introduces the creation of charities featuring inspirational influencers;
15. Encourages educational institutions to promote financial aid on scholarships;
16. Requests the providing of funds for all gender equality campaigns;
17. Further invites all member states to create gender equality movements.
