**Topic: Pandemic preparedness and response**

Acknowledging the need for organization in medical centers,  
Alarmed by the mistreatment of patients,  
Deeply concerned with long wait times,  
Also deeply concerned with poor planning of vaccine roll out,  
Also alarmed by the amount of patients left untreated and unvaccinated,  
Realizing the severity of the lack of medical centers,  
Observing the lack of necessary medical materials,  
Recognizing improper maintenance and upkeep of medical centers,  
Fully aware of underdeveloped technology,  
Noting with regret the understanding of medical centers,  
Alarmed by the false information found in social media,  
Taking note of the underdeveloped research regarding diseases and viruses,  
Noting the lack of communication between authorities and population,  
Taking into consideration the delayed response of the government upon pandemics,  
Noting with regret the amount of uncooperative citizens worldwide,  
Anxious about the lack of measures taken to prevent further spread of pandemics,

## **Hospital Organization**

1. Urges stricter sanitation and hygiene;
2. Encourages the separation of different severity levels of patients;
3. Calls for increased mobile medical services;
4. Adopts workshops to promote medicine careers;
5. Calls for equal distribution of vaccines globally;

## **Impact on and of citizens**

6. Endorses the opportunity to open positions for non-essential secondary online jobs;
7. Urges the reallocation of taxes to lower the impact of pandemics on society;
8. Further reminds others to practice safety measures to avoid the spread of diseases;
9. Strongly encourages citizens to take into consideration good preventative measures such as sanitization, hygiene, and social distancing;

## **Lack of resources**

10. Advises international collaboration for the distribution of resources;
11. Supports the idea to prevent waste of vaccines;
12. Authorizes the government to provide funds to medical materials;
13. Welcomes technologies innovations through contests with rewards;
14. Introduces the organization of public health systems;
