Topic: Right to food

Alarmed by the lack of awareness on child nutrition and hunger,

Expressing its appreciation on current efforts to improve hunger awareness,

Aware of conflict denying awareness to the right to food,

Deeply regretting that recent events have lead to lack of focus on food security,

Taking into account that millions of people suffer from food insecurity and malnutrition every day,

Noting with deep concern that hunger and malnutrition is happening globally and that this topic is very important for all,

Observing hunger and malnutrition are the causes of diseases and death,

Fully aware that 60% of irrigated crops (by weight) in the world are grown in areas with high level of water scarcity, making most crops die,

Acknowledging the global food production is sufficient to feed the entire population but without food management, some people still cannot get enough food,

Deeply concerned that some countries that do not have enough resources have only out-dated food in storage,

Deeply disturbed that if there are no international alliances during times of crisis such as war and natural disasters there can be an impact on food convoys,

Bearing in mind that a few countries import from countries facing war, as Russia and Ukraine which puts a further strain on the country's economy,

Deeply concerted that more than a hundred million people are suffering from starvation globally,

Fully alarmed that over 25% of food is being wasted globally,

Noting with deep concern that 20-40% of the deaths are caused by malnutrition,

Alarmed by the fact that over a million people do not have access to safe and secure food,

Confirming that there are not enough agricultural practices,

Affirming that bad hygiene and pesticides affect agricultural products,

Deeply concerned that most children are not educated about agriculture,

Observing that unhealthy or malnourished animals can carry diseases,

Alarmed by chemicals in agricultural practices harm the environment,

Accessibility and quality of food

1. Encourage the countries who have enough resources to donate to some to poor countries that cannot afford proper food storage to prevent hunger and malnutrition;
2. Further requests that countries work to help each other in need;
3. Calls upon all countries to start trade corridors so that vital crops be transported even during times of crisis;
4. Supports all the countries in peace building so they have a dialogue with each other;

Global solutions and problems for the right to food

5. Strongly encourages that many diverse countries could form training groups;
6. Further recommends that countries form a congregation to implement more sustainable and regenerative agricultural methods;
7. Emphasizes to governments the need to implement policies that improve food security;
8. Suggests that governments should decrease the costs of healthy food to make it more accessible for all;
9. Urges governments to work with schools on educating youth about food wastage;

Raising awareness on the right to food

10. Encourages further action towards awareness on child nutrition;
11. Urges nations and states at conflict to cooperate and rebuild their agriculture system;
12. Draws the attention of social media platforms to express its hope and appreciation for their efforts to improve hunger and child nutrition awareness;
13. Requests that countries develop programs to encourage food security and hunger awareness;

Sustainability in Climate Responsible Agriculture

14. Appeals that schools should add programs focusing on agriculture to motivate children to participate in agricultural practices;
15. Encourages embracing innovation and using modern technology to make agricultural practices more efficient;
16. Welcomes improved cloud seeding so that it does not harm the environment due to chemicals;
17. Further recommends providing healthcare for animals of great qualities used in food by creating a budget funded by charity donations.
