Topic: Women's meaningful participation in peace processes

Keeping in mind that women are afraid to speak out due to the lack of women in government and leadership roles around the world,

Noting further that there are not enough programs for girls and women to connect due to the fact that people do not acknowledge women's rights in leadership,

Noting with regret that women receive less opportunities than men because women feel afraid to speak freely and they suffer from harassment, bias and discrimination,

Alarmed by the fact that women are not involved enough in politics and seeing as there is a pay gap between women and men in governments,

Taking note that women get paid less than men,

Noting with deep concern that harassment against women still persists in many countries,

Deeply concerned that girls get less education than boys,

Taking into account that some traditional norms hinder women's participation in the peace processes,

Women's rights

- 1. Supports funding more projects that help women get into politics and reducing wage gaps towards women in governments to promote gender equality;
- 2. Further recommends to encourage more women to join peace processes as it has been proven that when women are involved, the outcome greatly improves;

Equal Pay/Education

- 3. Directs companies to pay men and women equally;
- 4. Calls upon governments to make education free for those who need it on an income percentage basis and create stricter gender sensitive laws;
- 5. Further invites people to create programs in the workforce to support women's rights about gender;

More Awareness

- 6. Encourages promoting girls education to help them speak out and others to participate in peace processes;
- 7. Calls for workshops that teach men about women's rights in order to bring men and women together to solve problems;
- 8. Approves of using social media to draw awareness to women's rights in order for girls and women to feel confident;

Government and Peace Processes/Action plans

- 9. Encourages countries to include women in all major decisions;
- 10. Urges social media influencers to create content on women role models for the encouragement of women and girls;
- 11. Draws the attention of governments to open up spots for women.
