Topic: Universal Health Coverage

Aware that many nations lack qualified medical personnel,

Realizing medical education is expensive, and that lowers the amount of medical students,

Noting that many nations have already put lots of funding into healthcare,

Acknowledging that many nations do not have adequate training for medical services,

Bearing in mind that universal health coverage or care is underdeveloped in most countries,

Deeply concerned that healthcare facilities may be understaffed or underprepared,

Further proclaiming hospitals are expensive to build,

Use of Money in Healthcare

1. Support the major spending of money to spend on healthcare and wellness systems in rural and unpopulated areas;
2. Calls upon the government to use a big portion of their funds for fundamental necessities such as healthcare and medical supplies;
3. Suggests that the government makes low priced, affordable, and quality healthcare;

Expansion of Universal Healthcare

4. Further requests the raise of medical professional salaries to increase the amount of medical students;
5. Supports organizations to help people in rural areas, like wellness systems;
6. Appeals for the government to support countries and conflict by sending medical professionals into them;
7. Emphasizes that funds from the government can help expand hospitals and improve overall healthcare in all nations;
8. Confirms that healthcare is right, not a privileg,;

Creating Better Education and Training Systems

9. Invites hospitals to do training for all situations;
10. Further invites nations to teach their citizens the importance of healthcare and basic first aid;
11. Call upon governments to improve training facilities;
12. Encourages the government to reallocate a lot of funding into health care systems;
13. Advises people to donate money using charities or crowdfunding and social media to medical fields;

Medical Strategies for Universal Healthcare

14. Recommends that countries collaborate and discuss Universal Health Care and their expertise;
15. Supporting the idea that countries should work together to ensure all people have cheap and affordable insurance;
16. Emphasizes if people abuse the health system it can lead to fines, used to improve infrastructure and healthcare;
17. Reminding that if we lower the cost of medical education around the world, more people may become doctors.
