Topic: The question of Palestine

Seeking member states to resolve conflicts revolving around war,

Deeply concerned about the terrorism and hate crimes in Israel and Palestine,

Acknowledging the impacts and effects of these war crimes on civilians,

Considering the human rights broken during the war,

Expressing concern for the Israel-Palestine conflict that has been lasting for 80 years,

Deeply concerned by the thousands of lives lost and millions displaced,

Bearing in mind the absence of funding supports towards humanitarian aid,

Expressing concern about the blockage and safety of humanitarian aid,

Fully aware of online activism bringing attention and donations to those impacted by the Israel-Palestine conflict,

Political Interference

1. Requires violators of human rights or terrorists to be taken to international court;
2. Calls for violators of human rights or terrorists to be charged and tried at international court;
3. Requests member states to endorse laws against killing civilians;
4. Expresses its hope for delegations involved in the conflict to have formal discussions;
5. Strongly condemns terrorist attacks and hate crimes;
6. Urges creation of terrorism reduction agencies;

Consequences for Combatants

7. Deplores the violations against both Geneva conventions and human rights;
8. Authorizes a partial arms embargo on both sides;
9. Expresses its hope to break religious tensions prolonging the war;
10. Recommends the creation of peace zones;
11. Strongly encourages the ban of the usage of weapons;

Geopolitical Solutions

12. Calls for a two state solution;
13. Expresses appreciation for international donations;
14. Supports peaceful interactions from foreign entities;
15. Suggests fair definition of borders made by foreign countries;
16. Suggests the implementation of UN peacekeepers;
 - a. to break political tension between Israel and Palestine
17. Instructs for peacekeeping committees be created for countries to understand one another;

Humanitarian Aid

18. Authorizes the release of hostages;
19. Strongly condemns the killing of humanitarian workers;
20. Calls for armed guards to provide safety for every group of humanitarian workers;
21. Expresses its appreciation towards humanitarian workers;

22. Requests priority for funding to be put on humanitarian efforts;
23. Encourages more ceasefires to allow for more humanitarian efforts.
