Topic: Right to food

Noting with deep concern environmental obstacles such as growing organic food, and farmers who are inexperienced in efficient farming methods,

Recognizing the importance of self sufficiency and food security, empowering local agriculture ensures sustainable production and strengthens communities and fosters long term resilience,

Noting with deep concern the lack of social equality for farmers and people from third world countries,

Recognizing that indigenous agriculture is vulnerable to crop dehydration like in some countries within Africa, higher organizations expresses its appreciation for good security programs,

Alarmed by the increasing prices and economic imbalance by lowering prices of food to combat increasing prices,

Bearing in mind the importance of international collaboration between member states with hopes of ensuring food security for all,

Encouraging member states to strengthen diplomatic ties and cooperative initiatives for mutual benefits,

Noting with deep concern the environmental obstacles to agricultural development,

Recognizing the increasing degradation of natural ecosystems due to pollution, deforestation, and climate change,

Food Production

1. Recommends the implementation of higher levels of agricultural education, focused on promoting sustainable;
2. Recommends efficient urban farming practices, in order to enhance food security and environmental resilience. Endorses governments to empower local farmers by providing better equipment, seeds, and training to enhance food security and resilience;
3. Calls upon member states to ensure that national food production is efficient;
4. Welcomes sustainable farming, fair distribution and resource protection to ensure food security, governments must support farmers and reduce waste and promote equal access;
5. Endorses the development of easy to grow and nutrient rich foods, including genetically modified crops;
6. Welcomes the development of plant fertilizer and animal feed from food scraps to prevent waste;

Social Equality

7. Calls upon all nations to ensure equitable access to land, resources, and education empowering marginalized groups in agricultural development and fostering sustainable growth;
8. Encourages the government to establish laws that help stop social inequality;
9. Encourages the lowering price of food so the civilians actively take part in country programs;
10. Calls upon governments to make fair wages for both gender to ensure the amount of food and the health of the citizens;
11. Suggests the government to expand school meal programs to ensure all children especially marginalized groups have consistent access to nutritious food promoting health and equality;

International Collaboration

12. Encourages international collaboration to enhance agricultural knowledge and food security globally;
13. Calls upon first world countries to help and give advice to struggling third and second world countries;
14. Recommends the study of efficient agriculture on both a national and international level and to ensure food security and prosperity for everyone;
15. Observing that promoting teamwork for all countries to grow affordable nutritious food has led to some territories promoting international cooperation;
16. Endorses cooperation among member states to ensure international treaties are upheld, finally fulfilled, and fully implemented;

17. Requests support for food storage technologies to reduce agricultural losses and improve food availability;
18. Requests launching a global initiative to share data on crop performance;

Environmental Impact

19. Calls upon nations to implement policies that protect ecosystems and biodiversity;
20. Welcomes eco friendly events such as greening to improve worldwide climates;
21. Supports education and awareness campaigns to inspire collective action;
22. Encourages international cooperation to implement united solutions and aid less developed countries;
23. Commits to reducing carbon footprint and fostering long term environmental and agricultural resilience;
24. Welcomes the growing of drought resistant crops;
25. Suggests international cooperation to improve the impact on rural families and for environmental protection worldwide.
