Topic: Reduction of Military Budgets

Recognizing the importance of raising awareness about the expenditure of military spending,

Seeking forward transparency and cooperation among nations,

Deeply concerned by the proliferation of destructive weapons and the lack of intention to achieve global peace,

Alarmed by the recent rise in military budgets,

Acknowledging the global rise in military funding and its impact on the economy,

Acknowledging that nations have to cooperate to reduce military spending,

Deeply concerned about the misunderstanding of the consequences of military spending,

Anxious that military spendings will increase if the issue is not communicated,

Strengthening Transparency, Dialogue and Tracking Military Spending-Throughout Nations

1. Strongly encourages raising awareness towards the matter through media and educational programs;
2. Calls for transparency through UN workshops, initiatives and agreements;
3. Also calls upon the creation of an annual forum in order to achieve international cooperation, communication, and the safe usage of weapons and bombs;

Discovery and Defense of Destructive Weapons and Funding of Technology for Aid of Reduction of Military Budgets

4. Encourages the creation of organizations in order to track military spending data with ethical and supervised usage of AI;
5. Suggests the reallocation of an amount of military budgets towards healthcare, infrastructure, climate issues and education through treaties and initiatives;

Comprehension and Cooperation Between Nations To Reduce Military Budgets

6. Calls for a regional pool of military funding of all countries offering substantial amount per country's quota when needed;
7. Requests nations to transfer part of their military spendings (depending on their financial context) into necessary programs related to the SDG goals;
8. Calls upon nations to participate in forums with experts that give ideas on how to reduce military budgets and ensure cooperation between nations;
9. Approves the importance of peace-keeping and transparency between nations;

Reallocation of Military Funding to Fund Other Project Areas

10. Confirms more international dialogue to build trust between countries and to make sure resources are used for the planet, not war;
11. Encourages nations to submit their monthly military budgets to organizations to create transparency.
