Topic: Relationship Between Disarmament and Sustainable Development

Acknowledging the benefits of disarmament on society and the consequences of weapons on the environment,

Anxious about the problems of healthcare and mental state of society due to weapons waste and conflicts,

Taking note of the illegal arms trade whether they are national or international,

Aware of the importance to transit toward better functioning security technologies,

Alarmed by the lack of international cooperation and awareness regarding sustainable development and the disarmament crises,

Deeply disturbed by the effect of chemical weapons and armed violence on society and the environment,

Fully alarmed by the need of civilians to collaborate in order to contribute to the SDGs,

Acting towards the reduction of economic waste in disarmament,

Impacts of Weapons of Mass Destruction on the Environment and Society

1. Encourages the redirection of energy sources from the military to society's needs;
2. Further recommends the maintenance of areas touched by nuclear waste and other forms of weaponry;
3. Draws attention to the youth to the issue of disarmament and non-proliferation of disarmament;

Disarmament and Nonproliferation Effects on Technology Systems on Sustainable Development

4. Calls upon countries to reinforce the security systems through the creation of organizations with the usage of AI and other technologies;
5. Invites countries to add programs and treaties in order to reduce military spending towards the accomplishment of SDGs;
6. Encourages countries to eliminate or reduce their arsenals of nuclear weapons;

Importance of Youth's Education Towards Better Sustainable Development

7. Calls for the implementation of programs to raise awareness about the military issues such as disarmament and non-proliferation to the future generations;
8. Considers international cooperation to incentivize civilians to collaborate in hopes of achieving the SDGs through the implementation of forums;

Economy Recovery and Mechanisms

9. Urges to enable the reduction of violence and military disarmament by implementing monitoring systems in order to achieve SDGs;

10. Advises trust and transparency promoted by international initiatives in order to improve economic dependence in over-militarization;
11. Supports proclaiming the importance of seeking a safer future where sustainability is an international commitment and where cooperation is achieved;
12. Calls for responsible governance, balanced defence budgets, and consistent respect for international laws within controlled communities.
