Affirming that there is a shortage of nurses and doctors in hospitals,

Taking into account that doctors don't have equal salaries,

Keeping in mind that transportation of medical equipment is now one of our biggest problems,

Noting with deep concern that some rural areas have healthcare inequalities,

Taking into consideration that hospitality training strongly increases support and cooperation from everyone,

Social Awareness on Healthcare issues and the need for better education

1. Encourages people to help reduce poverty by spreading awareness through media and campaigns;
2. Emphasizes the importance of better healthcare and education in rural areas;
3. Encourages people to become doctors to improve the healthcare system;
4. Expresses the hope for improved healthcare education in rural areas;
5. Deplores the lack of quality education due to funding;
6. Suggests expanding on existing treaties such as the International Health Regulations;

Encouraging the focus on prevention rather than curing

7. Further invites countries to provide more medical education to have more doctors/nurses in the future;
8. Reminds countries of the importance of health care for the entire population;
9. Suggests that economic support from the government is available for people;
10. Encourages the prevention of diseases and viruses by making organizations to conduct campaigns directed by hospitals;
11. Acknowledges the necessity of all countries to protect their population by using new technology;

12. Advises the population to go to the doctor for regular checkups to detect diseases early;

Investment and more production for tools and infrastructure in healthcare

13. Encourages forming alliances with countries that have better medical resources;
14. Encourages people to create more advanced technology for healthcare;
15. Calls for the recruitment of more doctors and nurses in hospitals;
16. Emphasizes the need for hospitals to increase the quality and availability of service;
17. Expresses its attention towards having more healthcare centers globally;
18. Draws its attention to countries that have better medical equipment and infrastructure;
19. Calls upon the importance of affordable healthcare;

Equal and Quality Healthcare

20. Also calls for people to donate to healthcare and create fundraisers;
21. Calls upon universities and hospitals to initiate foreign medical missions for their students;
22. Strongly encourages support and cooperation in terms of imports/exports from rich countries;
23. Invites scientists and engineers to introduce new methods to hospitals;
24. Draws the attention of less fortunate families to educational campaigns towards first aid;
25. Requests the governments to give refugees quality healthcare.
