#### **Topic: Children and Armed Conflict**

Alarmed by the scarcity of water and food for children in warzones,

Aware of the destruction of homes and lack of safe shelters,

Deeply concerned by the amount of children not able to meet their educational needs due to schools becoming warzones,

Deeply concerned that 1 in 5 children are being abused and harmed daily in conflict zones,

Alarmed by the amount of children facing malnutrition and don't have access to health support,

Taking into account the trauma caused by abuse on children,

#### **Funding**

- I. Calls for countries with a GDP of over \$800 billion USD to donate 0.01% of their GDP, every other year, to the construction and purchase of supplies for rehabilitation hospitals and shelters for children in war-affected areas;

## **Protection & Supplies**

2. Recommend that UN Peacekeepers are sent to guard and protect the resources sent and that the materials be contributed to online classes in areas of conflict;

## **Protection & Supplies:**

3. Urges countries to expedite the process of delivering the resources to address the problem as quickly as possible;

## **Health & Support**

4. Emphasizes the need for mental health support that benefits traumatized children, that integrates them back into safe communities;

## **Military support**

5. Further recommends spontaneous inspections of military units to search for under-age soldiers;
6. Military support: invites countries to adopt laws against the physical harm of children.
