Topic: The Human Rights of Migrants

Deeply disturbed by the growing abuse towards migrants and the rising effects of xenophobia globally,

Expressing concern about the lack of human rights and exploitation of migrants around the world,

Acknowledging each nation's right to their sovereignty and protection of their borders,

Reaffirming the historic similarities between discrimination against indigenous people and current day refugees,

Acknowledging the lack of healthcare, housing, and other resources provided to migrants globally,

Deeply concerned by the rising immigrant crisis and its negative impact on nations accepting refugees, migrants, and displaced people,

Support for Migrants

1. Requests that all states establish a national inventory of housing, healthcare and employment designated for migrant integration;
2. Affirms currency exchanges for migrants entering a new country;

3. Seeks fair wages and benefits for migrant workers to combat inequalities in the workspace;
4. Calls for the implementation of community centers and financial aid programs for migrants funded by NGOs, in the near future, as it is needed;
5. Encourages better healthcare in migrant and refugee camps;

Resources

6. Requests all states establish a national inventory of housing, healthcare, and employment designated for migrant integration;
7. Seeks fair wages and benefits for migrant workers to combat inequalities in the workspace;

Discrimination

8. Encourages the implementation of educational policies and campaigns against discrimination towards migrants;
9. Calls for the further establishment of security processing centers, along with temporary housing at borders, for the regulation of refugees and migrants by member states;
10. Requests the establishment of housing and communities specifically geared towards migrants;
11. Suggests the creation of educational seminars and language classes for migrants to support migrants' safe and proper transition into a new country;
12. Endorses the creation of neutral humanitarian corridors in the near future, which would offer protection for migrants;

Safety During the Migratory Process

13. Encourages cooperation between member states to lessen the systemic strain on nations accepting migrants in transition;
14. Affirms the law on the protection of the rights of migrants to access basic utilities without discrimination upon arrival;
15. Strongly advises member states to take into consideration the safety of their own residents while accepting migrants;
16. Calls for the further establishment of security processing centers, along with temporary housing at borders for the regulation of refugees and migrants by member states.
