Topic: Lethal Autonomous Weapons System

Alarmed by the number of people who have lost their lives due to Lethal Autonomous Weapons System (LAWS),

Fully aware of the dangers posed by LAWS,

Concerned by the risk of LAWS malfunction,

Bearing in mind that fully autonomous weapons can choose and attack targets without human control,

Fully aware on the growing threats of LAWS,

Recognizing LAWS are dangerous and have to be controlled,

Acknowledges that LAWS are becoming more common in modern warfare,

Humans Supervisions

1. Suggests test before the use of LAWS;
2. Strongly encourages the minimization of the use of LAWS;
3. Calls upon countries to consider inspections while using artificial intelligence in violence;
4. Requests the manufacturers of LAWS to add an emergency override;
5. Notes AI can be useful;

Regulating LAWS

6. Encourages international treaties to regulate the use of LAWS;
7. Suggests that no weapons of mass destruction are controlled by AI;
8. Strongly requests that countries develop LAWS accordance to pre existing IHL;
9. Confirms the importance of one international definition of LAWS;
10. Emphasizes the importance of international dialogue regarding LAWS to the general assembly and security counsel;

Controlling LAWS

11. Recommends to invite all member states to make LAWS are overseen by the UN;
12. Strongly suggests LAWS should have human oversight when being operated autonomously;
13. Further considers controlling LAWS to protect the country's population;
14. Encourages manufacturer to reinforce safety measures in LAWS;

Preventing civilians from being harmed by the use of LAWS

15. Believing in the creation of treaties and conventions to stop LAWS killing civilians.
