Topic: The Human Rights of Migrants

Noting with deep concern and regret that migrants are treated unequally due to the illegal arrivals of migrants and face challenges such as not enough medical health care,

Acknowledging that there is not enough food to go around,

Emphasizing that there is not enough shelter for people,

Acknowledging that migrant's gender rights is a severe world problem.

Bearing in mind that some migrants cannot get to their jobs because they can't afford or access transportation,

Seeking transportation for migrants,

Deeply concerned that migrants all around the world don't receive the pay they deserve;

Fully aware that many migrants don't have access or can't afford education globally;

Healthcare/Wellbeing

1. Declares accordingly better medical services and access to clean drinking water;
2. Strongly encourages humanitarian aid and shelter requests lower prices to essential needs;
3. Encouraged to donate necessities to migrants in need;

Laws and Gender Rights Concerning Migrants

5. Encourages alternatives to detention like decent housing;
6. Further requirements that migrant women and girls need to be heard;
7. Strongly condemns the exploitation of migrants especially women and girls;
8. Encourages legal frameworks to protect migrant's rights;
9. Calls for alternatives to detention and shelter for migrants

Work and Education

10. Calls upon all country's proactive construction of schools, offices, and other education-related buildings for migrants, as soon as possible;
11. Encourages the UN governments to help fund migrant education globally which would benefit many countries;
12. Urges all countries to integrate migrant children into school systems and delete discrimination from job opportunities;
13. Suggests to allow migrants to hold their former employment with recognition of foreign credentials, accelerating work qualification;

Transportation for Migrants

14. Draws attention to transportation companies to lower their prices of transportation for migrants;
15. Draws the attention that bus stops should be a walkable distance between places;
16. Further recommends that a fund that provides boats to migrants is provided for transportation uses as needed;
17. Further requests from governments to set-up free bike stations for migrants.
