### **Human Rights Council Committee**

### **Topic: Human Rights and Climate Change**

Acknowledging that too many greenhouse gasses are affecting people's health and warming the climate,

Acknowledging that fossil fuels are not cleaner than renewable energy,

Taking into consideration that climate change is a severe issue,

Alarmed by how fossil fuels affect the climate,

Fully aware that natural disasters have a big impact on the world and can strike at any time,

Deeply concerned that climate change is affecting human rights,

Acknowledging that climate change is affecting how people live, causing desertification deforestation, rising sea levels, as well as air and water pollution.`

### **Climate Action (Reducing Gases and Deforestation)**

1. Calls upon citizens to plant more trees and protect land;
2. Encourages citizens to use sustainable energy;
3. Adopts to expand already existing climate action programs;
4. Suggests more countries to make more trash pick-up groups;

5. Expresses its hope to use less vehicles that produce greenhouse gasses;
6. Further recommends building shelters for affected living beings;
7. Invites countries to promote alternative options instead of wood;

### **Clean Energy Usage and Sanitation**

8. Calls upon people to start using cleaner energy sources such as windmills, solar panels, and hydropower;
9. Further recommends countries to sign more climate treaties;
10. Expresses its hope to stop pollution;
11. Expresses its appreciation that countries have already taken steps for cleaner energy;
12. Encourages countries to start building sanitation groups;
13. Endorses stronger sanitation;

### **Protecting the World From Climate Risks**

14. Suggesting to create climate friendly job programs;
15. Invites countries to install natural disaster monitors to prepare before disasters;
16. Strongly encourages expanding the usage of solar powered water systems;
17. Recommends the increased use of sustainable farming practices;
18. Suggests that the UN should support an education program, informing people about climate change and the dangers it brings;

### **Sustainable Cities and Communities**

19. Encourages people to create more dams for flood prevention;
20. Further invites countries' governments to provide safe homes and nutrition/healthcare for citizens affected by natural disasters;
21. Encourages countries and organizations to invest in the UN;
22. Calls upon people to reduce the usage of plastic and greenhouse gases.
