Topic: Human Rights and Climate Change

Deeply concerned that climate change is affecting agriculture with heatwaves its effect,

Recognizing that climate change is disproportionately affecting women and indigenous people,

Aware of the natural disasters that are damaging homes and displacing people,

Acknowledging that people burning fossil fuels creates climate change,

Observing that many factories use systems that release greenhouse gases,

Deeply concerned that climate change is affecting agriculture with heatwaves, affecting and creating water, food shortages, and drought, ,also destroys houses when the sea-level rises,

Fully aware that the negative effects of water pollution and deforestation are decreasing the amount of wildlife,

Fully aware that the negative effects of water pollution and deforestation are decreasing the amount of wildlife,

Deeply concerned about the amount of cars using fossil fuels as an energy source which will affect the human rights of future generations,

Taking notice that because of the low percentage of renewable energy, along with the over use of coal and greenhouse gases global temperatures are rising,

Alarmed by the amount of pollution within the atmosphere, oceans, and cities,

Fossil fuels and pollution emission

1. Draws the attention to alternative energy sources, like nuclear, solar, and wind;
2. Affirming that if governments take initiative by creating policies which help the transition to eco friendly energy sources, we will be able to reach the 100% renewable energy goals by 2035;
3. Urging countries to help pollution clean ups which are government or charity funded environments;
4. Calls for government made policies, which prohibits smoking and vaping, as they both contribute to air pollution;
5. Recommends charities to fundraise for clean energy, as to stop using fossil fuels and other polluting sources;
6. Authorizes the use of biodegradable plastic in other countries to reduce the amount of micro plastics in the soil;
7. Encourages the creation of a separate committee in the UN with member countries that would deal with the usage of un-renewable energy sources and pollution;

Natural disasters

8. Endorses the creation of bunkers and shelters to protect people from natural disasters;
9. Calls for climate resistant homes;
10. Emphasizing the need for clean, safe water sources to avoid sickness and death;
11. Strongly encourages volunteers to plant trees because they act as a natural barrier against floods;
12. Requests a committee called Safer Environments for the people that educates the community about pollution and environmental issues;

Renewable energy

13. Urges to change plastic containers to biodegradable containers and materials;
14. Encourages countries to switch from oil and gas to wind and solar with incentives and donations;
15. Emphasizes the need for companies to switch to electric vehicle production because it will benefit them in the end;

16. Calls upon governments to switch to energy sources, such as wind mills, to stop the usage of coal;
17. Fully aware that landfills are being filled, due to the lack of renewable energy sources, and countries need to change this;

Climate change and our role

18. Acknowledges that humans should limit greenhouse gasses and instead usee renewable energy;
19. Encourages switching from gas stores to induction stores;
20. Adopts new methods to reduce the amount of tree wood being used to build houses and instead promotes natural resources;
21. Suggests programs that focus on reducing climate change by using green technology;
22. Further reminds people to recycle properly
