Topic: Advancement of Women

Education Equality

1. Considering SDG 5, we should call upon all countries to support education for women in developing countries;
2. Encouraging families to send all children to programs that teach about gender equality;
3. Invites all countries to protect women online and make programs that teach women how to protect themselves;
4. Requests all countries to support women in speaking up for themselves in education and to follow their passion;

Access and Opportunities

5. Calls for women and girls to be a part of decision making;
6. Suggests that women and girls get involved in public or school activities;
7. Encourages to give more job opportunities to women;

Rights and Democracy

8. Recommends that gender based global agreements should be strengthened;
9. Advises no harassment for women;
10. Directs hope for women to access quality education;
11. Further invites the society to allow women to participate in governmental decisions;
12. Also calls that girls should get equal opportunities as boys;
13. Approves healthcare insurance for women;
14. Further requests equitable programs to be updated at more regular times;

Finance and Healthcare

15. Encourages for women to fight for equal rights and opportunities;
16. Calls upon developed nations to give funds to healthcare for women;
17. Supports women to choose their own careers;
18. Urges for affordable and equitable child care;
19. Draws the attention for women to get more jobs and get more money, education and opportunities so they can pay their financial bills;
20. Reminds that women can create unions for equal pay;
21. Recommends that nations should decrease financial and healthcare costs for women.
