Topic: Advancement of Women

Deeply concerned that many women aren't getting accepted into universities,

Having considered that many girls at middle/high school are getting harassed,

Fully aware that affordable childcare is not always available,

Deeply concerned that women don't have extensive access to jobs in the government,

Noting that progress has been made to equal access to jobs in the government,

Acknowledging that not all women have equal voting rights,

Emphasizing equal job opportunities for women,

Expressing concern of the lack of safety for women online,

Acknowledging how many women have faced discrimination,

Noting with satisfaction the progress that has been made,

Education

1. Endorses the higher education of women;
2. Calls upon other countries who have experience in making progress in the advancement of women to advise or provide aid to other countries;
3. Believes that there should be more schools and training centers;
4. Calls upon the creation of more gender equal Science Technology Engineering Math (STEM) schools;
5. Considers good quality training for teachers so there is no bias on the topic of gender equality;
6. Advises for more country cooperation in order to build more equitable and accessible schools;

Affordable Accessibility

7. Calls for more accessible public services for women;
8. Encouraging access to accessible and affordable higher education;
9. Urges more affordable and accessible healthcare especially for women and children;

Employment Opportunities

10. Recommends more effective policies to eliminate gender discrimination;
11. Solemnly affirms equal pay, promotions and job offerings for women;
12. Proclaims the need to give recognition of women's achievements;
13. Urges further exposure to government roles for women;
14. Calls upon internship and training programs to help provide women with better job opportunities throughout the world;

Safety

15. Requests safety and no bias in the workplace;
16. Requires safety protocols as well as age requirements online;
17. Urges for stronger partnerships with Non-Government Organizations (NGO's);

18. Authorizes protection against physical harassment and mental harassment;

19. Further invites more support groups for women who experience violence.
