Topic: Refugee and Migrant Health

Aware that when migrants cross borders they can get hurt or sick by diseases, like malaria, and seeking funding by the UN for research facilities in 2027, in places that have a lot of immigrants,

Fully aware that most refugees and migrants have no support and no access to healthcare because countries do not like immigrants globally,

Realizing fundraising could help with protection in a lot of countries, such as being able to get new supplies,

Desiring more jobs and financing for migrants and refugees from HRC by 2035 all around the world so they can have better lives,

Aware that refugees and migrants all around the world are without food, water, or shelter's,

Noting with concern the poor conditions in which current international refugees are in some shelters,

Aware of the fact that some migrants and refugees are not able to afford proper shelter and basic needs in places like the poorer regions of South Africa,

Deeply concerned by the fact that very few jobs and housing opportunities are given to refugees,

Legal Healthcare Programs, Education, Housing, Support, & Protection

1. Introduces more housing support for all refugees and migrants through funding from UN agencies in 2027;
2. Encourages the creation of language barrier zones so migrants can understand the language of the country they go by funding through NGOs by 2028;
3. Emphasizes the need to strengthen healthcare systems for migrants and refugees connected by the WHO so lives can be saved in 2029;
4. Further request making more therapy offices for people who have PTSD and other mental illnesses through funding from NGOs by 2030;

Jobs, Language, Financing, Protection, & Fundraising

5. Encourages countries to build a global migrants and refugees health system to ensure the safety and security of migrants and refugees from all countries;
6. Further requests that the UN developed countries provide resources for developing countries to deal with refugees as soon as possible;
7. Supports countries having refugees to look for translators to help the newly refugees and migrants soon;

Free Healthcare, Basic Needs, & Donations for Shelters

8. Calls upon member states that hold refugees and migrants to guarantee emergency medical care for current international refugee and migrants immediately and globally;
9. Requests all countries to provide free healthcare to all refugees and migrants worldwide by 2030, by advertising worldwide;
10. Considers additional funding and medical resources to help communities that host large numbers of refugees by educating countries on the situation;
11. Encourages investments in healthcare systems so that both citizens and migrants can receive fair and effective care by creating regulations;
12. Acknowledges legal access to healthcare for refugees and migrants globally by 2030 with help from NGOs and governmental organizations;

Access, Administrative Borders, Housing, & Employment

13. Acknowledges that refugees and migrants only have access to low income jobs, where refugees are treated as second class;
14. Notes the fact that refugees and migrants have low access to national borders to places like Japan, the USA, Canada, or France, etc;

15. Encourages programs working with the refugees and migrants to create cheaper housing and have more employment opportunities in places like South America, Asia, and Africa, where there may be less affordable housing;
16. Calls upon the general governments to release reluctance of barriers of refugees and migrants by the 2030s.
