Topic: The Human Rights of Migrants

Alarmed by the amount of migrants fleeing conflict globally,

Aware of the lack of resources available to migrants, such as food, clean water, healthcare, and education,

Noting the importance of funding to improve migrant wellbeing including healthcare + education for migrants globally,

Recognizing that many migrants worldwide do not have a place to live and that housing is often hard to access,

Acknowledging that identification is crucial for the safety and wellbeing of migrants,

Aware of the discrimination and inhumane abuse towards migrants, especially women,

Noting with deep concern the continuation of deportation programs globally,

Bearing in mind the importance of the human rights of migrants in any instance,

Alarmed by the reduced job opportunities and wages for immigrants,

Cognizant of the reduced education for migrants and refugees,

General Safety of Migrants

1. Endorsing the protection of migrants crossing unsafe borders like the Darien Gap and the Central Mediterranean Sea;
2. Expresses its hope that migrants will be able to access affordable healthcare;
3. Emphasizes the protection of migrants in armed conflict zones, especially children;
4. Calls upon financially stable member states to provide resources for migrants in need;
5. Requests the protection of migrant children's rights regardless of their status or whereabouts;
6. Proclaims that safer detention processes are necessary to ensure migrant safety in detention centers;
7. Recognizes the needs of migrants in developing countries;
8. Recommends that all member states work together to resolve the issues that arise around immigration and migrant wellbeing;

Protection for Migrants

9. Calls on fellow member states to reduce funding to deportation programs and instead fund and support NGOs and programs that support asylum seekers;
10. Appreciates the UN's help in protecting migrants, but calls upon all member states to allocate more support and help to protect all people;
11. Encourages all authoritative figures to protect migrants, especially women and children from assault, rape, and gender-based violence;
12. Strongly condemns bias and discrimination in the workplace, and asks those in charge to provide protection and support for migrants in need of jobs;
13. Reminds governments and those with power to encourage healthy communication with migrants about governments and legal processes;
14. Further invites teachers and educators to include honest and informative information into lessons about migrants and asylum seekers;
15. Acknowledging detention centers are inhumane, implementing an education program for migrants would benefit them and aid their integration into modern societies;
16. Urges governments to deduct a percentage of taxpayer dollars going to detention centers and transfer it to food banks and affordable food donation programs;

Sustainable Migration

17. Designates labor opportunities for all migrants worldwide to promote economic stability;
18. Calls upon people who are not migrants to be aware of migrant situations around the world;
19. Recommends that countries with lower immigration rates help fund countries with higher immigration rates to help provide resources to migrants;
20. Emphasizes the importance of equal education opportunities for all migrants and refugees;
21. Endorses protection of migrant women and children everywhere;
22. Confirms job safety for all long term citizens in all countries;
23. Requests communication between refugees and local governments worldwide;
24. Strongly condemns the use of any deportation programs;
25. Advises the creation of global resource farms to support the basic needs of migrants;

Funding for Migrant Wellbeing

26. Endorses fast, safe and affordable public transportation for migrants between countries;
27. Calls for funding for non-governmental and governmental healthcare, housing, education, legal representation, psychosocial support and financial assistance programs for migrants world wide;
28. Reaffirms all types of healthcare as a crucial part in migrant well being and safety, especially for women and children with special health needs;
29. Recommends affordable housing for migrants globally;
30. Invites countries to provide job opportunities for migrants in all fields;
31. Approves subsidized education for migrants in every country;
32. Acknowledges the importance of financial assistance for migrants;
33. Advises countries to provide legal representation for migrants.
