### **Topic: Human Right of Migrants**

Acknowledging the lack of resources and quality care put into education for migrants,

Deeply concerned that migrants are not receiving the social treatment they deserve,

Recognizing that migrants lack any provided care and economic necessity,

Acknowledging how young migrants when separated from family during migration know little about their origins,

Emphasizing the importance of adaptation to and of migrant culture,

### **Help to access social infrastructure and education for migrants**

1. Emphasize the need for resources such as food, health care, transportation, electricity and housing ensuring that the migrants receive the lifestyle required to be successful in school;
2. Strongly encourages countries to devote more resources to the education of migrants;
3. Calling upon governments to improve/create integration programs for migrants;

## **Culture and human rights**

4. Calls for nations to support migrants culture;
5. Recommends all UN nations acknowledge indigenous knowledge of migration;
6. Urges for prevention against xenophobia and discrimination towards migrants keeping in mind country's cultures and opinions that may vary between member states;
7. Prioritizes the public knowledge of migrant rights;
8. Encourages consequences, which can vary by different cultures, for those who violate the rights of legal or illegal migrants as determined by member states;
9. Recognize the right of each member state to respect and protect their cultures;

## **Ensuring migrants have health and economic privileges**

10. Calls upon countries to increase funds for migrant healthcare and secure housing;
11. Urges countries to support migrants by supplying their basic needs;
12. Encourages countries to open adequate pathways for migrants to find jobs;

## **Laws to help the quality of migrant lives**

13. Calls upon member states to enact or improve laws to integrate other cultures;
14. Designates specific unoccupied land areas for migrant families to live;
15. Emphasizes the necessary improvements needed towards migrant processing facilities;
16. Recommends that governments supply the basic needs of migrants.
