Topic: Advancement of Women

Taking into consideration the lack of accessible education for the knowledge of equality,

Recognizing that many countries don't have the laws and resources to support women,

Noting with deep concern the presence of gender-based discrimination in the workplace,

Alarmed by the lack of adequate childcare due to the gender pay gap.

Alarmed by the fact that women don't have enough protection from gender based violence,

Noting with deep concern the increase in gender based violence,

Acknowledging the sexual and domestic violence that women are facing,

Deeply regretting that awareness for sexual violence is not widely recognized,

Education and Support of Women's Rights

1. Encourages individuals to spread awareness on equality through social media and public announcements;
2. Calls upon member states to create and enforce laws preventing gender segregation in classrooms;
3. Advises nations to adopt women's rights education into their school curriculums;

Women's Workplace and Financial Equality

4. Encourages the use of paid parental leave for all parents;
5. Advocates for adjusting wages to meet in a middle ground so that it is equal for all genders;
6. Calls upon employers to provide equal workplace opportunities for women;
7. Further recommends the implementation of subsidy credits for women after they retire;
8. Advises employers to provide support groups and programs for women who are struggling financially;
9. Expresses its hope to break gender stereotypes in leadership roles;
10. Strongly encourages the support for women entrepreneurs;

Ensuring Women's Safety

11. Strongly encourages increasing funding of sexual and domestic violence shelters;
12. Emphasizing the urgent need for gender based violence hotline especially in rural areas to protect women from domestic and sexual violence;
13. Encouraging education and awareness of the signs of sex trafficking and sexual violence;
14. Calls for the immediate elimination of child marriages;
15. Further resolves to outlaw automatic marriage consent;

Spreading awareness about sexual and domestic violence

16. Supports raising awareness through social media;
17. Welcomes victims of sexual and domestic violence to public events to share experiences with others to raise awareness;
18. Encourages schools to implement educational programs about sexual and domestic violence;

19. Emphasizes the importance of creating websites and apps for victims to share their stories to the public;
20. Strongly recommends the creation of ads and billboards which raise awareness about violence against women.
