



## **Resolution World Health Organization/2.1**

### **Refugee and Migrant Health**

Recognizing the poor living conditions of migrants and refugees,

Alarmed by the lack of fundamental resources such as housing, healthcare, food, water, and sanitation,

Acknowledges that healthcare is not widely accessible,

Deeply concerned by the lack of funding towards migrants when it comes to healthcare,

Recognizing the lack of benefits such as funding and recognition for NGOs,

Acknowledging the progress of the UNHCR on refugee and migrant health,

Acknowledging the mental, physical, and social effects that persecution has on refugees,

Taking into consideration the fact that 123.2 million migrants and refugees are currently seeking shelter.

## **Living Conditions, Accessibility, and Affordability**

1. Encourages governments to provide available funding to create an organization that provides refugees and migrants with better housing;
2. Urges governments to provide jobs for refugees and migrants to the best of the country's ability;
3. Calls upon governments to provide affordable and accessible education for all ages, especially for children, based on the economy of the host country;
4. Requests countries to provide accessible religious services while respecting countries' religious policies;
5. Emphasizes the importance of a safe environment and urges the UNSC to provide security from potential threats for refugees and migrants;
6. Advises the UN/NGO to distribute food and all necessary resources;
7. Recommends cooperation between countries to organize groups of migrants and refugees to increase efficiency of resource consumption;

## **Universal Health and Funding**

8. Calls upon the UN to help fund health care for refugees and migrants;
9. Further invites every country to introduce a health insurance system to help refugees and migrants get affordable health care;
10. Encourages the UN to help fund mental health treatments by allowing countries to receive loans;
11. Introduces a mutually beneficial contract to fast-track citizenship if the refugees benefit in the economy;
12. Suggests refugees and migrants volunteer for a job with the opportunity to work in exchange for services toward migrant and refugee health;
13. Calls upon countries to ensure that refugees get access to food, water, and housing by creating a committee that provides these necessities in order to prevent poor health.

## **International Organizations and Cooperation**

14. Encourages the UN to use a larger amount of its funds on refugee and migrant health organizations;
15. Calls for the implementation of the Global WHO action plan 2030;
16. Recommends countries to create treaties to allow migrants to enter and leave borders;
17. Calls upon universal healthcare for refugees based on the host countries' regulations;
18. Reaffirms the importance of international cooperation through summits and discussions;

19. Also calls for the recommendation of more accessible vaccines and clinics within member states;
20. Emphasizes the importance of education on refugee and migrant health within member states;

### **Safety from Aggressors**

21. Strongly encourages countries to provide refugees and migrants within their borders with basic necessities such as food, water, shelter, and health care to the best of their ability depending on the population of the refugees and resources;
22. Requests member states to set guidelines combating persecutions;
23. Welcomes the idea of creating more programs for the purpose of education, health, and safety for migrants;
24. Advises that member states take necessary precautions against natural disasters depending on geography and climate;
25. Also urges the creation of an accessible public transportation system for war zones;
26. Suggests individual member states establish adequate food resources for influxes of refugees within their country.
