Topic: Lethal Autonomous Weapons Systems

Acknowledging that AI has full control over LAWS,

Deeply regretting the mass production of LAWS,

Bearing in mind that AI can make devastating mistakes,

Considering that LAWS can choose and attack people by themselves,

Aware that contract killing might increase because of LAWS,

Alarmed by the fact that LAWS can't show mercy,

Deeply concerned about the lack of human control over LAWS,

Alarmed by the fact that LAWS could destroy without human knowledge,

Alarmed by the lack of attention to creating global plans for LAWS,

Deeply concerned about the lack of protection from laws,

The regulation of LAWS

- I. Encourages countries to regulate laws;

2. Invites countries to code LAWS so they don't have complete control;
3. Advises countries to write a treaty to regulate LAWS;
4. Urges countries to give LAWS a deactivating system;
5. Encourages an approval system for LAWS;

Ways to stop LAWS

6. Introduces adding a manual override switch for all LAWS;
7. Encourages funding NGO's such as stop killer robots;
8. Supports 2023 NAP agenda;
9. Encourages countries to agree to guidelines that regulate the use of LAWS;
10. Calls for treaties to be signed through each country to stop LAWS;

Human control over LAWS

11. Urges all countries that obtain LAWS to have an operator controlling it when active;
12. Direct countries to keep LAWS in war zones;
13. Further restricts the coding of LAWS;
14. Invites countries to add cameras to all LAWS;

Creating plans globally to protect against LAWS

1. Encourages countries to build more protection against LAWS;
2. Invites countries to have discussions about LAWS;
3. Requests countries to come together and reach agreements about LAWS;
4. Calls upon member states to build more safety shelters;
5. Further invites the protection of civilians from LAWS;
6. Urges countries to create response systems for attacks with LAWS.
