#### **Topic: Children and Armed Conflict**

Noting that children are being maimed and killed globally because there aren't enough peacekeepers,

Aware of the negative impacts happening because of the lack of peacekeepers, ensuring that the peacekeepers are safe as well,

Considers the lack of programs to help children in armed conflict,

Seeking the idea of giving children evacuation and therapy,

Acknowledging the importance of security in armed conflict,

Acknowledges that 493 million people lived in war zones in 2024,

Noting that children around the world have been harmed, recruited, and killed,

Emphasizing that the leaders are fully aware that millions of children are dying due to armed conflict, though only some are taking action,

Notes that ISIS, Boko Haram, The Taliban, Hezbollah, Al-Qaeda, Small Arms Trade, and more terrorist groups use child soldiers, and monitor these groups closer,

Also notes that many acts like the Child Soldiers Prevention Act are trying hard to help reduce problems associated with using children in armed conflict,

Aware that peacekeepers should be 25-55 years old,

### **Education for children in armed conflict**

1. Urges to add guards around the perimeter of schools to protect students, during times of conflict;
2. Strongly encourages evacuation plans for children in conflict;
3. Advises to have safety camps for children that are in armed conflict;
4. Endorses education rights for children in armed conflict;
5. Emphasizes providing humanitarian aid for children in armed conflict;

### **Peacekeepers for children in armed conflict**

6. Urges governments to provide resources to peacekeepers all around the world;
7. Acknowledging that there are not enough peacekeepers to protect minors;
8. Recommending that there be peacekeepers, representatives, volunteers, and CPS workers at military camps/bases and political buildings to keep watch for child soldiers;
9. Expecting peacekeepers to stop terrorist groups from harming minors;
10. Taking into account that peacekeepers need to be properly trained;
11. Encouraging minors to pursue peacekeeping as a career path and appreciate them;

### **Security of children in armed conflict**

12. Further requests for trauma care that promotes security for those in need;

### **Disarming groups who use child soldiers**

13. Regrets that children are still being used as soldiers, and the government is currently working on this issue using peacekeepers;
14. Requests that children are not used as body shields;

15. Strongly encourages people to report organizations using child soldiers;
16. Calls for the disarmament of groups that use child soldiers.
