Topic: Lethal Autonomous Weapon Systems

Acknowledging that LAWS are being hacked,

Aware of accidental deaths to civilians because of LAWS,

Fully aware of the amount of civilians harmed and killed by the use of LAWS,

Acknowledging those who stood up to stop the unethical use of LAWS,

Alarmed by the number of countries that use AI and autonomous weapon systems worldwide,

Acknowledging that AI is the main cause to most casualties and deaths,

Deeply concerned that LAWS are taking lives without human control,

Draws the attention to the amount of people killed by LAWS, however, only some governments are attempting to stop it,

Monitoring LAWS

1. Encourages to monitor groups who use LAWS;
2. Requests having human oversight being fully responsible for the destruction from LAWS;

3. Advises to make LAWS not allowed to make life/death decisions without human oversight;
4. Calls for a chain of command to see who is responsible for the destruction created by LAWS;
5. Requests having full transparency for countries who use LAWS;

Minimizing Production of LAWS

6. Urges LAWS to only be used for defense;
7. Advises that we make a treaty on how many LAWS you can manufacture;
8. Encourages less production of LAWS and instead focus on military forces;
9. Advises countries to defund companies that make LAWS for terrorists groups rather than those who use them for defense;
10. Invites countries to only allow the use of conventional weapons;

AI and Autonomous Weapon Systems

11. Calls upon countries to restrict LAWS so that citizens are safer;
12. Strongly encourages countries to place human supervision over autonomy;
13. Invites humans to always have control over AI, especially LAWS;
14. Further invites humans to have surveillance over LAWS;
15. Emphasizes that there be AI systems programmed ahead of time;

Helping Citizens be Safe from LAWS

16. Urges that governments use LAWS only for self defense, not attacking others;
17. Strongly encourages the UN to send unarmed assistance to countries who use LAWS;
18. Also calls for government to ensure that LAWS are kept out of neutral zones;
19. Calls for governments to make safe zones from LAWS;
20. Notes with satisfaction that countries like Australia, the United States, Israel, France, South Korea, and many more use LAWS safely, and to follow these countries' path;
21. Emphasizes and deeply condemns the use of LAWS in wars;
22. Demands that countries change the programming of LAWS to not harm innocent civilians.
