Human Rights Council Committee

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Topic: Human rights and climate change

Acknowledging that citizens' houses are being destroyed every day by natural disasters,

Recognizing that sea levels are rising worldwide,

Deeply concerned that global warming is increasing the frequency and intensity of natural disasters,

Affirming that greenhouse gases are a primary driver of climate change,

Aware of the construction of offshore oil rigs that pollute water, kill wildlife, and emit toxic gases,

Expressing concern that global warming is affecting and slowing crop growth,

Keeping in mind that countries are attempting to find renewable energy sources,

Recognizing that glaciers are melting, causing habitat loss and possible extinction for polar animals,

Realizing that the waste of financial resources makes preventing climate change increasingly difficult,

Aware of the fact that people often waste energy,

Recognizing that people frequently ignore the environmental impact of pollution,

Observing that many individuals do not recycle even when recycling options are available,

Deeply disturbed that greenhouse gases are polluting the atmosphere,

Alarmed by the increasing number of tornadoes and hurricanes due to climate change,

Seeking easier access to healthcare for individuals injured by natural disasters,

Recognizing that deforestation may reduce the availability of natural resources used in medicine,

Natural disasters and protection

1. Emphasizes that housing infrastructure must be strengthened and better protected against natural disasters;
2. Draws attention to the need for barriers and protective walls to protect coastal populations from sea level rise;
3. Calls upon construction companies to build safer and more sustainable housing;
4. Underlines the need for safe shelters where citizens can go during natural disasters;
5. Recommends that houses in flood-prone areas be built on stilts or built inland to reduce fatalities;
6. Encourages disaster relief funds from wealthier nations to support less wealthy countries;
7. Instructs governments to provide disaster warning systems accessible even to people without electronic devices;

8. Highly recommends the establishment of disaster cleanup services funded by national taxes of approximately 1–2%;

Greenhouse gasses and environmental/disaster clean-up, glaciers melting, money waste

1. Recommends that the amount of greenhouse gas emissions be reduced globally;
2. Suggests stronger action against pollution caused by offshore oil rigs;
3. Further recommends that countries cooperate to produce and implement renewable energy sources;
4. Approves the idea that all countries should aim to achieve net-zero carbon emissions by 2100;
5. Urges countries to rationalize their international budgets in order to better fund climate change prevention and mitigation efforts;
6. Encourages awareness and fundraising initiatives to support renewable energy development such as solar power;
7. Supports the reduction of fossil fuel burning;
8. Further recommends the desalination and recycling of reclaimed water through closed-loop cooling systems for high-energy facilities such as AI data centers;

Reduce, reuse, recycle (energy)

1. Declares that individuals should conserve energy by turning off unnecessary lights and electrical devices;
2. Further invites educational programs to teach citizens about climate change, recycling, and reusing broken or unwanted items;
3. Encourages people to donate unwanted items to charity rather than discarding them;
4. Further requests the development of neighborhood gardens that incorporate composting systems;

Health

1. Calls for increased fundraising to support medical assistance for those affected by climate-related disasters;
2. Encourages the construction of additional emergency rooms in disaster-prone regions;

3. Further recommends the development of additional hospitals to improve healthcare access;
4. Welcomes easier access to hospitals for individuals injured as a result of climate change-related disasters;
5. Recommends ensuring the availability of trustworthy and qualified doctors in affected regions;
6. Advises the construction of shelters around farms to protect food supplies and support community health.
