Topic: Human Rights of Migrants

Alarmed by the amount of migrants and refugees today,

Concerned by the decrease of money and increase of prices in the world today,

Confident that there has been discussions about migrants having places to live,

Acknowledging that most migrants have lost safety and denied transportation,

Bearing in mind many migrants lack the feeling of safety in their community, this why many of them are migrating across the globe,

With no regret, we want to put a stop to this so everyone can get their rights they deserve,

Firmly convinced that countries are failing to recognize that their human rights are being violated dearly,

Further noting that safety and transportation-wise, these are solutions countries can improve on,

Notes that migrants need access to legal paperwork and identity for equal contribution,

Taking into account the lack of sufficient food for migrants and refugees around the world, and many people without proper homes nearly starve every night,

Deeply conscious of the shortage of availability to healthcare for migrants and refugees around the world,

Having devoted attention to the shortage of clean, healthy water in refugee camps,

Noting with regret that many people around the world cannot afford to live in a full, comfortable home,

Having examined and found information, most kids do not have access to proper education,

Alarmed that many children and babies do not have the resources they need to survive,

Safety and Transportation

1. Encourages countries to make jobs accessible to all cultures and languages;
2. Allowing access for resources for extreme weather (hot and/or cold);
3. Calls for all living resources such as food, water, etc. for migrants and refugees;
4. Requests that countries apply these suggestions into actions;
5. Believes these few solutions can keep the 304 million migrants around the world safe and protected;

Children and Education

6. Encourages people to make a program to help parents pay less for their children's education;
7. Acknowledges the many children that should have fundraisers and events to earn enough money to buy things that they need to survive;
8. Reaffirms to the children who can draw attention to other countries for help with building schools and places for all;
9. Reinforces the idea of donations for children's clothes, baby food, and necessities for them;
10. Advises schools to hire more teachers and have more teaching programs;
11. Urges schools to host more fundraisers to gain more money;

12. Requests more affordable schools and daycares should be built as parents cannot afford it if they are not affordable;

Access To Healthcare, Food, Water, and Housing

13. Calling upon people with the ability to help with many things, like creating food near camps, giving migrants reliable, weekly food delivery, and building accessible markets as well;
14. Encourages leaders to build migrant-only hospitals to make sure there are affordable prices;
15. Calls upon member states to help the cause of having available clean water sources all around the world;
16. Recommends there to be good homes for migrants and refugees as soon as they arrive;

Global Issues

17. Authorizes funding migrants so they can support themselves until they have a stable income;
18. Calls upon member states to assist migrants in finding employment;
19. Supports UN funding for migrants who are in need of food and water;
20. Draws attention to the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, which states everyone, including migrants, are entitled to human rights;
21. Urges law officials to not use lethal force or weapons on anyone, including migrants, unless two thirds of the committee agrees;
22. Calls for humanitarian aid to counties with insufficient resources to make sure migrants have their basic human rights met;
23. Further recommends a UPR-based system, but for the human rights of migrants to make sure their rights are not being violated;
24. Emphasizes making sure that people in regions of conflict can safely migrate out.
