Alarmed by the amount of trees that have been cut down today,

Convinced that people are the most effective sources of pollution and deforestation,

Fully aware of the effects of humans' machine and factory developments,

Noting with regret the amount of animals affected by climate change,

Reminds people of the effects of climate change on their own lives,

Deeply conscious of the growing effects that climate change can have on people and animals,

Fully aware that globally, the burning of fossil fuels expedition is the shift in temperature,

Seeking to achieve excellence in the development of renewable energy sources,

Reminds that in 2011, climate change caused a generational storm in Denmark called the Cloud Burst,

Alarmed by the high rising sea levels caused by melting icebergs and climate change,

Noting that storms would hit, making water rise above sea levels causing water to overflow, flooding the streets,

Noting with approval, soil erosion is natural particles that get detached, transported, and deposited elsewhere by water, wind, and gravity,

Environmental Protection

1. Encourages non-plastic nets that only collect a small amount of fish;
2. Suggests a job where the people get paid to go underwater and collect trash in the ocean;
3. Introduces the idea of limited times of the year for hunting different species and a limited amount of each;
4. Supports the idea of a rule that proclaims that the amount of trees you can cut down, you have to plant

5. Calls for governments and schools to edit school curriculums to inform children about climate change;
6. Welcomes the idea of children being leaders in their community when speaking about climate change;

7. Reminds the community and governments that collecting rainwater can help against desertification;
8. Expresses its hope for the next generations to become leaders in climate protection;
9. Reiterates its call for a set maximum amount of greenhouse gas emissions for countries and companies globally;

10. Encourages building more wells for clean water;
11. Encourages all member states to start working faster to accomplish the goals that were set out in the Paris Agreement;
12. Reinforces planting more trees that can cool hot areas, clean the air, and help animals;

Human Contribution

13. Draws attention to all the problems and solutions people have been causing;
14. Urges large human populations to stop deforestation;
15. Allows people to contribute in cutting down fossil fuel use;
16. Trusts people to stop buildings that increase greenhouse emissions;
17. Calls upon larger countries to assist smaller countries with the stopping of greenhouse gas emissions;
18. Calls for recycling from all countries to reduce the amount of garbage and waste in landfills.
