Topic: Democracy for Education

Observing that different cultures don't get the same rights,

Fully aware that kids aren't getting a good education in a lot of places because of their different cultures,

Taking note that disabled kids are getting treated differently,

Noting that kids from different cultures are not included in education,

Acknowledging that kids are getting discriminated against because of skin color, country and ethnicity,

Acknowledging that students around the world are lacking education,

Deeply aware how more than 750,000,000 adults worldwide remain illiterate,

Noting with concern that most schools don't teach democracy whatsoever,

Also noting that 40 percent of teachers worldwide lack teaching resources to effectively teach democracy,

Expressing concern that some adults still are yet to be educated on the topic of democracy,

Acknowledging that different races are being excluded,

Keeping in mind that equality is being ignored,

Noting the absence of student rights,

Conscious that some children get more opportunities than others,

Observing that teachers do not take enough action to help their students,

Stressing that children deserve the same rights,

Acknowledging that teachers don't get paid as much money as other jobs,

Realizing that many kids can't afford school,

Aware of the lack of funds to make sure kids are getting the materials they need for their education, such as technology, writing materials, and books,

Noting with deep concern that children and schools often don't get enough money for the supplies they need,

Democracy in Different Cultures

1. Encourages countries to lower the voting age to sixteen;
2. Strongly encourages schools to teach kids to believe what they want to believe;
3. Invites people to be kind to other people regarding their skin colour;
4. Affirms people from different cultures to be treated equally;
5. Advises countries to hire and train multilingual/multicultural teachers who can translate for students from different cultures;

Teaching and Learning Democracy

6. Advises member states to create a separate learning space for democracy;
7. Encourages countries to pay more attention to teaching democracy in schools;
8. Instructs nations to supply more funding to support programs about education for democracy;
9. Requests that the UN creates democracy programs in countries that do not already have programs;

Antiracism, Equality, and Student Rights

10. Urges people to be aware of racism around them;
11. Encourages other races to connect;
12. Advises teachers to respect student rights and give children equal opportunities;
13. Reminds students that they can take action to protect their rights;
14. Calls upon parents to educate their children about racism and why it is bad;

Monetary

15. Requests that more funds are sent to schools worldwide;
16. Suggests education of students and teachers would be better with more funding;
17. Urges that countries use their tax money to help pay for education;
18. Emphasizes that more money should be put towards school transportation;
19. Requests that part of the funds are given to schools to make the cost of going to school cheaper;
20. Urges the nations to create organizations to help students receive the tools and materials they need for their education;
21. Advises better school lunches for students and to make the lunches free.
