The Republic of Korea states that it will be taking many initiatives to assist in coming to a peaceful solution. But the one that they are pushing across the most is their education initiatives to teach and inform countries about the ongoing humanitarian crisis in Sudan. The way that they plan on spreading awareness and education is by funding news agencies like the British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC), to cover the topic and show the people what is happening and how to help.

Although the Republic of Korea has not directly been involved in peace talks, they are providing and donating to organizations such as the World Food Programme (WFP) to provide life-saving nutrition to the millions of displaced people because of the situation.
