Topic: Empowering Youth in Inclusive and Sustainable Food Systems

Recognizing the importance of education in empowering youth for sustainable food systems,

Fully alarmed about low participation of youth in agricultural activities and educational programs,

Noting with deep concern the large population unaware of youths' trouble in food systems,

Reaffirming the need of international cooperation between member states when concerning the food systems,

Recognizing the lack of information concerning food waste in food systems,

Acknowledging that food-related occupations are essential to food production,

Providing Knowledge About Food Systems to Youth through Education

- I. Emphasizes the youth participation in educational systems through elective courses in school to ensure more people's health and food safety in future generations and improve people's access to good quality food;

2. Encourages greater access to financial resources and land for young farmers in order to provide better education programs;
3. Reaffirms youth participation in agricultural internships in educational spaces by giving students the opportunity to practice agriculture and develop skills in this topic;
4. Recommends strengthening youth agricultural knowledge to build resilient and sustainable food systems;
5. Confirms the lack of mentorship of agriculture and suggests making campaigns to provide opportunities for youth to learn about agriculture systems;

Raising Awareness of Food Systems Globally

6. Affirms the necessity of organizations that can provide food supplies to people in need;
7. Calls for raising awareness about food systems worldwide through agricultural internships in educational spaces;
8. Urges assistance for global awareness;
9. Further invites member states to agree on an international treaty that increases youth participation in agrifood systems;
10. Calls upon all countries to use media to raise awareness of food systems;
11. Encourages schools to create awareness programs for students;
12. Calls upon delegations to build resilient and inclusive values;
13. Acknowledges that empowering youth in food systems could boost global GDP 1.4%;

Youth and Agricultural Partnerships

14. Encourages FAO technical support for youth cooperatives and community-based agribusinesses;
15. Calls to promote the international exchange of information concerning sustainable food systems;
16. Urges youth in rural and urban communities to participate in food systems;

17. Endorses the funding of the development of technology via international partnership;
18. Requests increased governmental aid in order to involve youth with the agricultural occupations;
19. Appeals to governments to create learning hubs for students globally to interact with the food systems;
20. Further invites all nations to implement a FAO youth food policy;

Sustainable Agricultural and Food Production

21. Encourages the reduction of imports in national markets;
22. Calls for more people to help with food insecurity;
23. Suggests the use of clean products for food production instead of preservatives;
24. Calls for more youth to help with food production;
25. Urges youth to express their decisions in food systems;
26. Draws the attention to the current state of the world's food production
27. Urges adult assistance towards this issue;
28. Suggests food production with the help of youth to develop clean and sustainable products around the world.
