Topic: Empowerment of Rural Women

Noting with deep concern the lack of mentorship, education and training for rural women,

Expressing concern for the lack of accessibility of fertile lands or healthcare for rural women,

Recognizing the reduced availability of information for individuals regarding the accessibility for rural women,

Taking into account that governmental funds are needed for women in agriculture especially in low income communities,

Deeply concerned about low income female workers experiencing harsh financial conditions,

Fully aware of the fact that millions of women are excluded because of gender inequality,

Taking into consideration the lack of empowerment that rural women face daily,

Raising Awareness

- I. Calls upon Member States to support raising awareness for rural women using media and education;

2. Considers promoting leadership for the communities of rural women through educational programs;
3. Encourages the creation of training programs to empower rural women in rural areas through governmental organization;
4. Urges member-states to collaborate in the constructions of hospitals in rural areas;

Improving Economic Strategies to Empower Low Income Communities

5. Draws attention to implement safeguards for rural women in working sectors;
6. Emphasizes the need for leadership and market inclusion among rural women through mentorship programs;
7. Encourages strengthening women-led rural cooperatives and implementing technical and financial training programs to foster economic and digital inclusion;
8. Expresses the need to increase governmental funding in collaboration to ensure rural women's health through secured healthcare;
9. Recommends Member States to offer loans and/or micro loans to finance women owned businesses;
10. Requests more affordable housing for women in low income rural communities, through the United Nation's logistics and financial support;
11. Supports organizations to allocate funds towards the education of rural women through digital means;

Accessibility for Rural Women

12. Calls for the government to reduce the prices of basic needs and products in rural areas in order to increase accessibility;
13. Proposes the creation of new organizations led by rural women to increase agricultural output;
14. Invites Member States to provide land rights for rural women;

15. Suggests the use of agricultural technology in education centers to encourage more knowledge and awareness so women can develop useful skills;
16. Recommends the accessibility of rural women to more tools and resources by providing support from the UN;
17. Further recommends the implementation of agricultural educational programs for rural women through school systems;

Training towards Women in Agriculture

18. Further invites professional mentors to educate rural women on eco-friendly farming methods by creating training programs;
19. Expresses its hope on the UN countries to come together to form educational classes on business for rural women through campaigns;
20. Calls for more mentors and teachers to contribute to the education of rural women through summits hosted by the UN;
21. Encourages entrepreneurs knowledgeable on automated farming tools to teach rural women on how to use them.
