Topic: Human Rights and Climate Change

Deeply concerned by the lack of knowledge and action regarding climate change as well as human rights,

Alarmed by the amount of pollution from large companies that accelerates climate change,

Recognizing existing programs that spread awareness about climate change and its abuse of human rights,

Alarmed by the impact on the global climate by the overuse of fossil fuels and overconsumption of single use plastics,

Aware of the humanitarian crisis caused by climate change, such as displacement, disturbance of lifestyles, destruction of ecosystems, mass casualties due to natural disasters, and the risks to sailors and fishermen due to rising water levels,

Renewable Energy and Resources

1. Encourages countries to use trash cans in public spaces to properly dispose of trash and single-use plastics to avoid environmental pollution;
2. Urges nations to repurpose plastic and other materials into energy and fuel;
3. Adopts programs that bring people of all ages, especially the youth, closer to nature, and teaching them to recycle plastic for daily use;

Rules and Regulations

4. Calls upon companies and all Member States to plan using sustainable energy and the adoption of renewable resources of electricity to reach net-zero;
5. Suggests to impose regulations condemning the usage of fossil fuels by companies and advises nations to require corporations to increase production of renewable energies;
6. Further invites able countries and HRC Member States to contribute to existing programs that allow citizens in vulnerable communities to participate in climate policy design;

Information Dissemination and Education

7. Encourages schools to incorporate lessons and events about government policies against carbon emissions and deforestation;
8. Strongly recommends nations to adopt education summits provided by the HRC specialized to each country;
9. Calls upon nations for endorsement of awareness and prevention along with climate education;
10. Calls governments of all nations to create funds for climate change and deforestation awareness;

Environmental Aid and Protection of Humans Affected by Climate Change

11. Encourages states to conduct geographical surveys of green spaces to introduce flora and fauna into the ecosystem and increased biodiversity;
12. Requests, NGOs, and Member States to support displaced people with temporary housing and document recovery services to assist their eventual integration into society;
13. Calls upon further fundraising for healthcare workers and hospitals to treat those who have experienced mass injuries due to climate change.
