Topic: Human Rights and Climate Change

Anxious about the lack of preparation for anthropogenic climate change, water scarcity, and natural disasters,

Deeply concerned about the physical and mental state of the people due to the lack of education and preparation for the effects of climate change in communities, children, the youth, senior citizens, and people with disabilities,

Fully alarmed by how migrants' security is affected by climate change, especially in urban areas,

Fully aware of how overpopulation leads to overconsumption and its effect in climate change,

Noting that the transportation has a huge impact on climate change, especially in urban areas,

Alarmed by the lack of government aid in the economic sector in times of calamity, disaster and wars,

Fully aware of the lack of resources, including housing, for those who are in poverty due to climate change,

Safety and Climate Change

1. Urges Member States to invest in safe, sustainable, public transportation to make it available for everyone and reduce the overuse of fossil fuels;
2. Recommends creating a committee dedicated to promoting the effects of climate change in society through social media to engage with young people;
3. Considers creating a law that prevents cars that use high-emission fuels from entering natural conservation areas;
4. Also urges governments to invest in irrigation systems and drought-resistant crops to prevent agriculture and its workers from suffering because of climate change;

Climate change effects in peoples' economy

5. Encourages the government to supply gateways to people affected by climate change through subsidies and job opportunities;
6. Further invites Member States to provide economic safeguards by creating and providing insurance policies for natural disasters due to climate change;
7. Requests the support of the governments that hold a surplus of economic resources to buy the surplus of unaffordable houses to provide them for the people who are affected by climate change;
8. Suggests to invest part of Member States' GDP for free healthcare services to those who are unable to afford it;
9. Invites Member States to provide food to those who are impoverished due to climate change by obtaining unserved food from commercial establishments and farmers;

Government Contribution to Climate Change Mitigation

10. Draws the attention to people using personal cars and invites governments to incentivise public transport by advertising it and making it electric and free;
11. Invites Member States to punish activities such as deforestation, dangerous nuclear fission and fusion, overuse of coal power and other fossil fuels, and waste of energy through fees and fines;
12. Encourages Member States to provide investigations on noncontaminant technology by sponsoring investigators;
13. Underlines the idea that bicycles become more common in cities by investing money in bicycle companies;
14. Encourages Member States to adapt their countries so they can be better prepared for natural disasters, always with inclusive policies;

Lack of preparation during global warming

15. Suggests that Member States build underground shelters with access to healthcare systems, food, and water for communities and migrants in need of it during natural disasters;
16. Encourages the enforcement of a climate change policy in which if someone surpasses an amount of consumption considered damaging for the ecosystem, such as car dealership, overproduction, and water waste, they will have to attend community service so they can reduce, reuse, recycle, and repair the ecological damage;
17. Recommends that companies increase the production of nitrogen cars and reduce the oil-dependent cars;
18. Further recommends more programs and seminars for all ages to spread awareness of climate change by demonstrating the procedures in safety preparation for different types of calamities in order to support Sustainable Development Goal 13.3;
19. Emphasising the need to develop infrastructures for water storage, such as rainwater harvesting, which is crucial for handling droughts;
20. Expresses its appreciation for adding shelters on borders so migrants can have access to water and other basic needs.
