Topic: Refugee and Migrant Health

Fully aware of the struggles that immigrants and refugees experienced due to racism and poverty,

Observing that not all nations have the resources to support,

Acknowledging that migrants are unaware of healthcare procedures,

Realizing migrants don't have quality healthcare accessibility,

Recognizing the fundamental right to health for all individuals, including refugees and migrants,

Deeply concerned about the significant barriers and constant discrimination towards refugees and migrants.

Recognizing the lack of safety of the immigrants and refugees,

Taking into account the migrants and refugees' basic needs,

Support and Prevention

1. Calls for all Member States to assist everyone by providing resources and supply packages;
2. Advises vaccination programs globally for refugees and migrants;
3. Recommends specialized psychologists for refugees and migrants in need;
4. Urges Member Nations especially economic powers to fund NGOs that support migrants and refugees;
5. Urges nations to prevent discrimination against refugees through education programs
6. Encourages disease surveillance in refugee and migrant camps;
7. Strongly encourages Member States to allow safe passage for migrants and refugees within their jurisdiction;

Educating Migrants on Free Healthcare

8. Emphasizes the need for multilingual health care providers;
9. Calls for collaboration between governments and NGOs to educate migrants on medical rights;
10. Urges NGOs to train migrants to become translators in hospitals;
11. Encourages educational facilities to give out scholarships to migrants wanting all to enter the health care field;
12. Recommends educational facilities expand the curriculum to teach how to help migrants, especially in the medical field.

Aid, Equality and Funding

13. Calls upon all Member States for them to guarantee equal access to health care services for refugees and migrants;
14. Urges all Member States to give means of financial aid to refugees and migrants,
15. Requests all related committees in the UN to create a health fund for refugees and migrant camps;
16. Draws the attention of nations to support migrants in a humanitarian crisis;
17. Emphasizes the creation of educational programs for medical staff regarding cultural understanding;
18. Underlines the importance of a check-in by the UN to ensure every migrant/refugee has the basic needs;

Safety for Migrants

19. Calls upon countries to enact and enforce stricter laws regarding the safety of migrants and refugees;
20. Emphasizes the need for funding;
21. Strongly encourages the establishment of international organizations that provide basic needs;
22. Urges the governments to create campaigns that spread awareness of the need to protect migrants and refugees;
23. Affirms the need for safer learning environments for the youth;
24. Endorses the monitoring of traveling migrants when crossing borders and the creation of safer routes.
