Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations

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Topic: Empowering Youth in Inclusive and Sustainable Food Systems

Observing that old farmers are retiring and that we do not have enough to continue the job,

Noting that most of the youth do not want to participate in agriculture and farming,

Underlining that our agriculture production is limited,

Alarmed by the level of food waste being above the ideal limit,

Acknowledging that there are currently risks of droughts, floods, heavy winds, and similar disasters affecting the food systems,

Noting with deep concern that climate change can hurt living beings near or in the environment,

Deeply concerned that the prices and the limited numbers of crops are costing many farmers their jobs, as the shipments are being blocked off due to war caused by conflicts,

Taking into account that children in school are not being properly educated on agriculture and that youth are missing opportunities,

Including Youth in Food Systems

1. Encourages youth participation in food systems, by joining clubs and making posters designed by youth;
2. Introduces youth into agricultural education, by adding agricultural programs in school;
3. Requires proper training for agricultural youth, by having more programs and courses on agriculture and more real life experiences;
4. Calls for safer work spaces for farmers by giving them safer, government funded materials;
5. Strongly encourages proper food security;
6. Invites the government to help agricultural farms by funding farmers;
7. Requests modern technology in farms to make machinery easier and safer for youth;

Farming Strategies

8. Encourages people to help increase financial support in agriculture by owning rooftop gardens, and/or small farms;
9. Acknowledges governments to modernize farms by training young farmers, and training existing farmers in new technology ideas;
10. Calls for more sustainable farming by building more artificial farms;
11. Urges the government to slow down building cities and to build more farms and greenhouses, by advertising that building more cities is harming our farms and food systems;
12. Recommends schools to make a subject on agriculture as this option may get more young people involved in farming;
13. Emphasizes that using daily life technology in farming could attract youth;

Facing the Conflicts of Global Farming

14. Urges farmers to use nature-safe products and methods in order to make their crops healthier;
15. Invites farmers to gain recognition about climate change and its effects by making it mainstream via the news and social media;
16. Emphasises the idea of increasing global warming protection groups by advertising the idea to youth;

17. Appeals to the idea of reducing the amount of greenhouse gases by using more electric vehicles and less gas-fueled vehicles;
18. Introduces awareness of world hunger through an education program;
19. Notes further that we can give a voice to the people and farmers that are affected;

Farming Economics

20. Suggests that governments lower interest on loans and use that money to make more farms;
21. Urges schools and communities to promote farming clubs for youth;
22. Acknowledges that accessibility can be increased by making transportation methods better;
23. Invites schools to educate youth about agriculture;
24. Encourages food markets and further invites the idea of having more food markets;
25. Calls for more field trips for schools to go to public farms.
