#### **Topic: Empowerment of Rural Women**

Deeply concerned that rural women do not receive the same education as men,

Alarmed by the rate of rural women who cannot afford proper education,

Acknowledging that rural women are not treated equally to men,

Alarmed by the fact that rural women are not acknowledged for their hard work,

Observing that rural women do not have access to banks,

Fully aware that rural women do not have enough access to jobs, healthcare, etc.,

Acknowledging the lack of land rights and resources for rural women,

Conscious of gender inequality in rural areas,

#### **Rural Women in Equal Education**

- I. Calls upon the government to promote literacy and agricultural skills training for rural women;

2. Encourages schools to equally educate rural girls and boys in class;
3. Supports the use of technological devices to empower rural women and girls by giving them access to mobile devices;
4. Believes safe rural communities for women are created through education;
5. Urges the government to build more schools / programs for rural women;
6. Provides an option for rural women to become decision makers such as professors to decide what students will learn;

### **Equality Amongst Genders**

7. Urges all managers to submit monthly surveys that measure wage equity amongst genders;
8. Calls for the government to build more hospitals in rural areas;
9. Appreciates global education for men about rural women's rights;
10. Strongly encourages businesses to acknowledge the talents of rural women, by having events for women to share their talents;
11. Calls upon communities and governments to treat all genders equally;

### **Banking and Finance for Rural Women**

12. Urges governments to invest in better public transportation for rural women;
13. Appeals to non-government organizations to provide business education for rural women;
14. Encourages the government to improve rural women's finances by creating a microloan system;

### **Equal Farming Land and Resources for Rural Women**

15. Calls for the creation of information and training centers in which information and knowledge is shared with rural community women;
16. Considers allocating women to local farms via their government;
17. Urges retired farmers to work towards donating their old tools to new farmers;
18. Invites retired farmers to work towards donating their unused land for use by rural women;

19. Encourages fundraisers to help rural women achieve more resources for use in agriculture;
20. Calls upon the government officials to make programs that provide all farmers, including rural women, help to get better equipment;
21. Strongly encourages more professions directed to women.
