Topic: Human Rights of Migrants

Realizing that migrants do not have access to standard health care, shelter, nutritious food and quality education,

Deeply concerned that many migrants' physical health and mental wellbeing are affected by lack of access to basic human needs,

Realizing that most migrants do not even have access to transportation,

Concerned at the amount of discrimination that migrants receive which limits equality and justice,

Taking into account the fact that migrants do not have the proper care that they need and deserve,

Convinced that migrants need the proper knowledge of the countries' laws and languages,

Fully aware that migrants do not receive equal access to jobs,

Migrant Health, Healthcare, and Shelters

1. Urges other states to build community centers that would provide more nutritious food, water, and quality healthcare;
2. Strongly encourages better job opportunities for migrants, so they can find a steady job;
3. Draws the attention of governments to build hospitals around borders and in countries, or use existing hospitals to support migrants;

Education

4. Urges communities to help migrants have school programs and free quality education;
5. Suggests that governments build schools and learning centers for migrants in need of it;
6. Supports the idea of more education in transit countries;

Equality and Justice

7. Suggests the help of nations to support migrants to be listened to and for their rights to be understood;
8. Welcomes the idea of creating temporary jobs for migrants until they find stable jobs;
9. Emphasizes the creation of a campaign that raises awareness to give opportunities to people to learn more about migrants' lives, which will be done with TV entertainment, celebrities, and influencers;

Population Awareness and Aiding Migrants

10. Endorses nations to teach laws and languages to migrants that migrated to foreign countries;
11. Invites other countries to help fund hospitals for migrants.
