Topic: Human Rights and Climate Change

Recognizing that not all countries can afford and/or access natural hazard aid,

Alarmed by the fact that developing countries do not get enough funds,

Acknowledging that global warming is causing climate disasters such as irregular weather, sea disasters, and land disasters,

Bearing in mind that climate change is affecting the environment and that having a clean and healthy environment is a human right,

Acknowledging that nowadays many countries use non-renewable energy, such as gas and fuel, which are damaging the environment,

Acknowledging that climate change is flooding farmlands, which can impact the food industry,

Concerned that the people are not earning enough money to be able to afford renewable energy for food or daily human needs,

Aid of Natural Hazards

1. Calls for early warning systems to minimize damage from natural disasters;
2. Calls upon communities to aid those in need;
3. Welcomes the idea of evacuation systems so there are less casualties;

4. Strongly encourages communities to raise money for people in need caused by natural disasters;

Pollution, Global Warming, and Greenhouse Gas Emissions

5. Accepts building more wind turbines and solar panels - by doing this instead of using fossil fuels, it will help the climate and everything living within it;
6. Calls upon nations to reduce the amount of factories causing pollution;
7. Welcomes the idea to introduce more electric cars and solar panel boats;

Renewable Energy

8. Strongly suggests the government to produce more windmills and more renewable energy;
9. Urges governments to build factories with solar panels so that food can be made while saving energy;
10. Requests governments to make more policies that will help reduce the usage of non-renewable energy;

Human Needs and Rise of Water

11. Encourages other member states to transition to renewable energy such as wind turbines and electric cars;
12. Supports the idea of architectural adaptations, such as floating cities and buildings, and replacing negative buildings that cause pollution with eco-friendly ones;
13. Condemns mass deforestation because it can lead to extreme weather events.
