Topic: Empowerment of Rural Women

Taking note that women should have equal education and that schools cost a lot,

Taking into consideration that women need healthier diets,

Noting with satisfaction that women have been given more access to modern tools,

Emphasizing that there are stereotypes about rural women's jobs and roles in the community,

Recognizing that many rural women in nations still struggle to educate their children and feed their families every day,

Noting with deep concern that every day people will be violent towards women because of their gender,

Realizing that rural women do not have equal income opportunities or rights, but continue to provide for their communities,

Aware of women not receiving the same income as men,

Healthcare

1. Considers that girls in rural areas should be taught how to help their community;
2. Confirms improving gender equality, especially for rural women, because they are treated unfairly;
3. Reminds that when rural women have positive contributions around the world, they should be appreciated and given credit for the work they do;
4. Considers that rural women should be welcomed into places where they can help other communities and other people's interests;
5. Further recommends the governments of Member States to lower the cost of schools or make some schools free, without fees, so people in rural areas can go to school without any financial issues;
6. Calls upon governments to make more schools just for rural women;
7. Recommends that more hospitals are built in rural areas so healthcare can be accessible for rural women;
8. Further requests the government to give more funding to hospitals so that healthcare can be more accessible for people in rural areas;

Education

9. Authorizes creating programs to help rural women find jobs in urban areas;
10. Further requests educating people in urban areas about rural women for other governmental organizations to help;
11. Further considers improving the quality of life for more young women by providing young rural women with more tools;

Economic Adjustment

12. Emphasizes that the Member States should provide loans and internships to help invest in food production and processing;
13. Recommends that Member States provide money needed for young women to learn about modern agriculture and climate smart agriculture;
14. Considers that people and the area should try to promote rural women in economics;
15. Encourages more programs to support rural women and further encourages other nations to aid rural women;
16. Considers that rural women have financial barriers especially in rural areas, and it would be essential to create programs like the International Monetary Fund (IMF) to support women in their financial situations;

Legal Protection and Economic Opportunities

17. Requests to give women more voting rights;
18. Calls upon the Member States to establish legal and institutional frameworks to ensure gender equality in each nation;
19. Further requests government policies to be put in place to protect women against gender-based violence;
20. Reminds that some government policies are against solving women's problems, while most governments are not.
