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Topic: Empowering Youth in Inclusive and Sustainable Food Systems

Recognizing the global challenges of hunger and the essential role of farmers while calling attention to the need to uphold their wellbeing as central to food security,

Emphasizing countries to consider United Nations support to citizens and children without access to nutritional food as well as addressing a healthier lifestyle and diet, due to their health and well being,

Recognizing that pollution from littering, plastics, inefficient irrigation, and abandoned structures undermines the sustainability of agriculture and food systems,

Alarmed by rising pollution from plastics, inefficient irrigation, and abandoned structures as well as increasing gas prices, highlighting the need for electric cars as a cheaper and cleaner alternative to protect sustainable agriculture and food systems,

Recognizing the importance of education in preparing and including youth for sustainable agricultural practices,

Acknowledging the importance of technology in improving agricultural systems,

Deeply concerned about the lack of awareness of agricultural and educational issues,

Concerned by the limit of agricultural education opportunities available to youth in developing nations,

Taking into account bigger budgets for classrooms,

Deeply concerned about the number of unemployed youth, especially young women,

Alarmed by the large number of supermarket chains,

Welcoming getting youth involved through social media, education and summer camps,

Bearing in mind the issue of food loss and waste and its impact on food security and sustainability,

Taking into account current food waste levels and government imposed fines for food waste management violations,

Seeking to strengthen and expand local food banks in order to improve food distribution and reduce hunger,

Food and Nutrition

1. Encourages launching a convergence initiative and creating inclusive food systems that are interconnected by better health care and free food initiatives at schools;
2. Strongly recommends more climate-friendly-based farming through supporting local and youth farmers as well as using various farming techniques that adapt to climate change;
3. Authorizes support to local farmers with natural resources and funding through more taxes going towards helping reduce food waste through compost;
4. Resolves to strengthen sustainable food systems and expand the youth nutrition programs to guarantee healthy meals for all;
5. Recommends integrating weather forecasting tools into farming practices to help youth farmers prepare for climate change and protect the crops;
6. Endorses youth empowerment through various actions such as youth entrepreneurship and youth volunteerism in different food programs to build resilient food systems;
7. Encourages nations to establish professional training for youth farmers that emphasize sustainable agriculture and nutrition sensitive practices;

Caring For and Raising Awareness for the Environment

8. Endorses youth-driven research and innovation hubs focused on creating new technologies that minimize pollution in farming and food supply chains;
9. Encourages new apps and machines to help farmers grow more food and improve food systems;
10. Promotes youth-led renovation of abandoned structures transforming them into assets for sustainable agriculture;
11. Acknowledges that we should have more alternatives for plastics and pesticides;
12. Encourages the strengthening of legal frameworks that enable young farmers to access resources, grow more food sustainably, and contribute to cleaner agricultural systems;
13. Proclaims that biodegradable plastics should be more common so that sea life does not go extinct;
14. Reminds that places in close proximity with wildlife should enforce stricter laws against littering;

Education and Technology in Agriculture

15. Requests to provide youth with global education and hands-on experiences;
16. Further requests funding for education and training tools in rural areas to bring awareness;
17. Supports training programs for farmers on how to use agricultural technology;
18. Recommends governments to provide youth with a voice in policy making;
19. Further recommends more technology for farming and other agricultural work;
20. Emphasizes the need to create initiatives that train and support youth in agriculture;
21. Supports research and innovation in sustainable farming practices;
22. Strongly implores schools to include more hands-on learning activities such as projects, experiments, and field work;
23. Reminds nations to include the youth's voices in agriculture and reminds the nations to include the youth in decision-making;
24. Expresses its hope for bigger budgets for classrooms;
25. Urges a better education system for the youth;

Laws and Decrees

26. Requests local family-run businesses instead of larger chainstores;
27. Recommends local farms to include youth by imparting courses and classes on food security;
28. Calls for the implementation of green-skills days in schools to promote environmental awareness and sustainability skills among students;
29. Encourages stricter litter laws;
30. Raises awareness to the importance of enforcing laws to reduce waste;
31. Advocates reducing the cost of producing fresh and organic products;
32. Calls for more youth participation in agricultural policy making and governance structures;
33. Strongly recommends more more electric cars and a younger voting age;
34. Calls for reduced property taxes on farmland to support small farmers and improve food production;
35. Further requests committees to have community compost bins;
36. Further urges countries to strengthen cooperation and trade essential goods in order to improve global food security;
37. Considers implementing laws and policies to reduce food waste and improve food management;
38. Encourages countries to participate in boycotting and peaceful protests;
39. Further recommends that youth food justice programs be implemented to hire youth;
40. Requests an international grant fund for climate smart farming.
